

Applications are invited for a Term Adjunct position in the Aging and Health Program, with responsibilities for AGHE 901 Knowledge Translation and Uptake. AGHE 901 is a required PhD course, delivered on-line during the 2017-18 winter term (January to April, 2017), with a maximum expected enrolment of 10 students. To allow for course revisions and delivery, this position is available from November 1, 2017 to April 30, 2017.

The successful candidate will have expertise and experience examining and applying theoretical and methodological foundations of knowledge synthesis, translation, and uptake into practice. Candidates must have a completed doctoral degree (e.g., PhD, EdD) and focused training and expertise in knowledge translation. Previous experience teaching at the graduate level is preferred. Experience working in systems affecting older adults is an asset, as is past experience teaching on-line. The incumbent will have 50% responsibility for course revisions, delivery and student evaluation and will be required to work closely and collaboratively with the co-instructor. The course description follows:

AGHE 901 Knowledge Translation and Uptake

An examination of the foundations of knowledge synthesis, translation, and uptake into practice with emphasis on definitions, frameworks, barriers and facilitators, interventions and evaluation and developing knowledge translation plans.

The University invites applications from all qualified individuals.
