Course Description

OT 884 Psychosocial Dimensions of Occupation II

This course builds on attitudes, knowledge and skills developed in Psychosocial Dimensions of Occupation I. Students will learn theoretical frameworks, practice approaches and evidence-informed interventions relevant to complex psychosocial issues within a range of specific occupational therapy practice contexts. Weekly labs will provide the opportunity for further skill development. (4 CR)

*This course will focus on intervention to improve psychosocial function.

TA Qualifications

Duties:

Assistance with labs: The TA will assist with the implementation of several labs. This will include assisting with the set-up of lab sessions and supporting student involvement in lab sessions.

Assistance with grading: The TA will assist with grading midterm and final exams and intervention portfolios in May/June.
