Course Description

OT-885 Physical Dimensions of Occupation II

Weight = 3 credit units

This course analyzes human occupation from the perspective of its anatomical, physiological and biomechanical dimensions. The course will focus on intervention methods used in physical rehabilitation to enable occupation in musculoskeletal conditions. The course is designed to build on concepts introduced in OT881 and will use an integrated case study format to further develop an understanding of movement of the human body as it relates to occupation.

Theoretical frameworks and evidence-informed practice approaches and interventions will be addressed in class and weekly lab sessions.

TA Qualifications

Degree in occupational therapy; those with a background in physical therapy or kinesiology will be considered. Experience in the area of physical rehabilitation. Knowledge of Canadian models of practice and documentation formats an asset.

1. Facilitation and mentoring of students in team based learning and clinical skills sessions.
