

# **PT 858 TA Requirements (Total of 40 hours) 2017-18**

**April 1 – June 30, 2018**

Course Description:

## **PT-858 (4.5CR) Neuromotor Function II**

Students will gain knowledge regarding a range of conditions that compromise neuromotor performance in adults. Students will gain skills in identifying movement problems, setting goals and planning physiotherapeutic intervention for adults with compromised neuromotor performance. Lab component.

Knowledge of neurological disorders would be an asset.

### **1. Assistance with student academic performance evaluation:**

With training and guidance from the course co-ordinator, the TA will be responsible for grading student assignments and/or examinations. The TA will be required to be present at both the Objective Structured Clinical Examination and the final written examination in order to assist the course co-ordinator in ensuring they are run smoothly and with academic integrity.

#### **Essential Skills**

- Strong written skills and ability to offer feedback to enable student improvement;
- Ability to document student performance and marks in a timely fashion;
- Willingness to learn the student internet/web platforms (e.g. 'OnQ');
- Willingness to track the content of the course leading up to any evaluation; and
- Ability and willingness to accept constructive feedback from the course coordinator.

### **2. Delivery of clinical skills laboratory component and its evaluation**

The TA will assist the course co-ordinator and team of laboratory instructors with logistical support for the laboratory skills sessions.

#### **Essential Skills and Elements**

- Ability to attend the twice-weekly laboratory skills sessions of the course;
- Ability to participate in the Objective Structured Clinical Examination in May
- Ability to assist the instructor in administering the final written examination
- Strong organizational skills; and
- Ability and willingness to accept constructive feedback from the course coordinator.
