

**Job Description**  
**Research Associate – Casual Part time**  
**Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation**

*Temporary employment until approximately July 2024, subject to the availability of work.*

*The successful candidate will work under the direction of the Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation Clinical Research Unit in the role of “**Research Associate**”.*

*The incumbent will deliver exercise programs following the research study protocols, to study participants with spinal cord injury, acquired brain injury, stroke, and other conditions.*

*The successful candidate may also perform physical assessments according to the study protocol to determine a participant’s physical abilities, and report the results of those assessments to the research team.*

*Other job duties may include liaison with industry, patients, physicians and healthcare workers; management of clinical trial documentation; reporting adverse events to the study coordinator, and providing support to the clinical trials team. This position is casual part-time, up to 37.5 hours per week depending on the availability of work.*

*Tasks for which the incumbent may be responsible for:*

- *Conducting baseline physical assessments (i.e., height and weight measurements)*
- *Collecting demographic data (i.e., age, sex, details of condition and medication use, gender-related factors—such as gender identity, employment, partner status, living arrangements, caregiving and household roles, and education)*
- *For online assessments, ensuring technology is functioning and home set-up is appropriate*
- *Conducting physical and cognitive function assessments*

**Essential Qualifications:**

- Master’s degree in a regulated health profession
- Successful completion of PCE preferred
- Experience delivering exercise programs to participants with stroke, spinal cord and/or acquired brain injuries
- Excellent verbal and written communication skills in English. Ability to effectively communicate general and clinical information both verbally and in writing at all levels.
- Ability to work independently and make decisions. Good judgement, initiative, tact and professional attitude in the workplace.
- Adaptable, flexible and resourceful. Ability to multi-task and meet deadlines.

**Preferred Qualifications:**

- Experience working in an academic/research environment
- Training in ICH/GCP guidelines.
- Familiarity with Lawson Health Research Institute policies and procedures an asset
- Demonstrated ability to lead and work in teams, e.g. including with faculty, staff, students and residents
