COURSE DESCRIPTION:

This course introduces students to the central construct of occupation and to both the consequences and determinants of occupation. We will explore the most prominent theoretical models and theorists of the past 100 year to develop an understanding of the relationship between occupation, health, and the factors that affect occupation.
