<b>COURSE DESCRIPTION:</b>
This course provides students with the foundational knowledge to identify factors influencing performance and participation for children and adolescents. Evaluation and intervention approaches at the level of impairment, activity limitations, and participation restrictions will be explored by considering the context of service provision systems and the diverse roles of Occupational Therapy practitioners in collaboration with families and inter-professional service providers.
<b>DUTIES:</b>
Grading assignments in consultation with course coordinator and supporting a lecture and lab and interactive classroom sessions. Doctoral students may have the option to prepare and deliver lectures. The incumbent would be responsible for marking the final exams.
<b>Topics include</b> milestones, working with families, development of occupation, self-care, social participation, hand function, writing, behavioral disorders, challenging behaviours, mental health, motor learning, cognitive interventions, special education, feeling, technology, mobility, CO-OP.
