# **COURSE DESCRIPTION:**

This course introduces students to human occupation from the perspective of its anatomical, physiological and biomechanical dimensions. The course will use an integrated case study format to develop understanding of movement of the human body as it relates to occupation. The course will focus on the assessment methods used in physical rehabilitation and introduce musculoskeletal conditions as they relate to occupation. Theoretical frameworks and evidence-informed practice approaches and interventions will be addressed in class and weekly lab sessions.

# **FALL TERM HOURS:**

OT 881 is offered in the Fall term with an expected enrollment of 70 students. The classes will take place from 3:30 - 5:30 p.m. on Thursdays and 8:30-10:30 a.m. on Fridays during the indicated timeframe.

# **DUTIES:**

Assist instructor during weekly OT clinical skills labs; assist instructor in grading case presentations; assist with set up and administration of OSCE. May take on teaching responsibilities, in consultation with the course supervisor. Clinical skills labs take place on Fridays. The case presentations take place during class time. The OSCE will take place in December, TBA. The incumbent must be available to attend various in-person sessions on campus. Inperson sessions will be conducted in compliance with all Public Health safety guidelines.

# **QUALIFICATIONS:**

Successful candidates must be eligible for registration with the College of Occupational Therapists of Ontario and have advanced knowledge and experience in clinical education. A master's degree is preferred.
