COURSE DESCRIPTION:

Students will apply their knowledge of professional issues, anatomy, physiology, biomechanics, physical assessment and intervention to develop skills in patient interactions and handling, mobility and function. Topics include communication skills, documentation, mobility aids, wheelchairs, transfers, balance & coordination, functional task analysis & outcome measures, and hydrotherapy. Using a case-based approach, students will be able to assess and interpret findings with regard to altered mobility. Lab component.

ROLE OF THE TA:

Grading of student assignments

With training and guidance from the course coordinator, the TA will be responsible for grading student assignments and/or written examination, based on detailed grading templates provided by the course coordinator.

Essential Skills

- Strong written and oral communication skills and ability to offer feedback to students on their performance with a direct but supportive approach
- Ability to document student performance and marks in a timely fashion
- Willingness to track the content of the course leading up to any evaluation
- Ability and willingness to accept constructive feedback from the course coordinator

The TA will assist the course coordinator with logistical support for the OSCE.

Essential Skills and Elements

- The TA will be required to participate in the December OSCE, logistics and/or marking of the written component stations

If the TA is a registered physiotherapist, they may provide logistical support and/or evaluation with the OSCE, as well as the clinical skills

- If the TA is a registered physiotherapy, they may provide logistical support and/or evaluation with the OSCE, as well as the clinical skills testing that are a component of the assessment of student performance in the course

Course content delivery

The TA may be involved in assisting the course coordinator with logistical support for the practical sessions, including, but not limited to, gathering laboratory supplies and equipment, setting up the lab space prior to practical session, attending some practical sessions and assisting with the clean-up following some session.

Essential Skills and Elements

- Familiarity with the supplies and equipment used in the course (e.g., mobility aids)
- Willingness to keep comprehensive records of supplies and equipment usage and maintenance needs
- Ability to interact with equipment vendors who are providing equipment on loan for clinical skills labs
- Strong interpersonal skills
 - o to assist the students with relevant, timely and valid feedback
 - o to assist with interactions with the Faculty of Health Science's (FHS) GSK Clinical Education Centre, FHS Clinical Simulation Centre and any other relevant university resources
 - o to work with clinicians within the faculty and from regional health facilities
- Strong organizational skills
- Actively participate in clinical teaching in selected laboratory modules

The TA may negotiate involvement in the development and/or delivery of course theory content.

Essential Skills and Elements

- Willingness to consider multiple methods, taking into account adult learning styles
- Ability to, when relevant, incorporate a critical review of the literature to update all materials
- Ability to provide materials in a timely fashion
- Strong organizational skills
- Ability and willingness to accept constructive feedback from the course coordinator.
