Applications are invited to a Term Adjunct position with 50.00% of responsibility in OT 801 – Conceptual Models in Occupational Therapy from August 1, 2026, to December 31, 2026.

OT 801 is a 4.00 credit masters-level course, with expected delivery during the Fall 2026 academic term. The incumbent will be responsible for 2.00 out of 4.00 credits, and Dr. Beata Batorowicz will teach the remaining credits. We are starting the contract early to allow the incumbent time to prepare for the course. The course is offered as a course for masters-level students in the Occupational Therapy (OT) program. The successful candidate will have theoretical and practical expertise within the field of occupational therapy. The candidate will be abreast of foundational and current conceptual models within the field. Previous experience teaching at the graduate level is preferred.

The course description follows:

OT 801 (CR 4.00) Conceptual Models in Occupational Therapy

This course introduces students to the central construct of occupation and to both the consequences and determinants of occupation. We will explore the most prominent theoretical models for understanding the relationship between occupation and health, and the factors that affect occupation. The course also covers the historical development of occupational therapy theory, and key theorists over the past 100 years.

The University invites applications from all qualified individuals.
