Applications are invited to a Term Adjunct position with 100.00% of responsibility in OT 885 – Physical Determinants of Occupation II from August 1, 2026, to December 31, 2026.

OT 885 is a 3.00 credit masters-level course, with expected delivery during the Fall 2025 academic term. We are starting the contract early to allow the incumbent time to prepare for the course. The course is offered as a course for masters-level students in the Occupational Therapy (OT) program. The successful candidate will have theoretical and practical expertise related to physical rehabilitation within the field of occupational therapy. The candidate will be abreast of intervention methods used in physical rehabilitation to enable occupation in musculoskeletal conditions. Previous experience teaching at the graduate level is preferred.

The course description follows:

OT 885 (CR 3.00) Physical Determinants of Occupation II

This course analyzes human occupation from the perspective of its anatomical, physiological and biomechanical dimensions. The course will focus on intervention methods used in physical rehabilitation to enable occupation in musculoskeletal conditions. The course is designed to build on concepts introduced in OT881 and will use an integrated case study format to further develop an understanding of movement of the human body as it relates to occupation. Theoretical frameworks and evidence-informed practice approaches and interventions will be addressed in class and weekly lab sessions.

The University invites applications from all qualified individuals.
