Applications are invited to a Graduate Teaching Fellow position with 67% of responsibility in OT 875 – Advanced Professional Practice from December 1, 2024, to April 30, 2025.

OT 875 is a second year, three credit masters-level course, with an expected enrolment of 70 students, delivered in the winter term of 2025. The incumbent will be responsible for 2 out of 3 credits co-teaching with Dr. Catherine Donnelly. We are starting the contract early to allow the incumbent time to prepare for the course. The course is offered as a course for masters-level students in the Occupational Therapy (OT) program. The successful candidate will have theoretical, methodological and practical expertise in research within the field of occupations therapy. The candidate will be abreast of current research within the field. The candidate must have completed their doctoral-level research proposal. Previous experience teaching at the graduate level is preferred.

The course description follows:

OT 875 (CR 3) Advanced Professional Practice

This course is designed to provide students with opportunities to acquire an advanced understanding of the roles, rights and responsibilities incumbent with becoming an Occupational Therapist. Particular attention will be given to the legal and ethical parameters of practice, professional contributions and responsibilities within complex and changing environments and career development as advanced healthcare professionals. Course content is designed to be responsive to the shifting practice environment and offer students an opportunity to synthesize learning from other courses within the curriculum.

The University invites applications from all qualified individuals. Queen's is strongly committed to employment equity, diversity, and inclusion in the workplace and encourages applications from Black, racialized/visible minority and Indigenous/Aboriginal people, women, persons with disabilities, and 2SLGBTQ+ persons.
